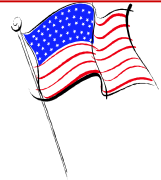

Minutes of the February 21, 2013 GENERAL BUSINESS MEETING



The formal General Meeting was called to order by President Julie McVey at 6:30 PM

Secretary's Report – Ed Branco

Ed asked if everyone read and reviewed the January General Meeting Minutes. Judy Rezendes made a motion to approve and Ralph Garcia seconded. All approved and the January 17, 2013 General Business Meeting minutes were accepted.

Treasurer's Report – Craig Kirkpatrick

Craig reported that we received \$2,168 from VFW 2013 Car Show Reimbursement, \$1,422 from Car Show Deposits, \$29 from Pin and Plaque Sales for total receipts of \$3,619. Expenses of \$42 for Operating Supplies/Expense – Web Hosting, \$500 (contribution) for Lincoln Little League Baseball, \$903 (split \$602 for Operating/Supplies and \$301 for Car Show expense) for insurance with Motherlode Insurance Services, \$112 for Membership Benefits and \$1,547 in Car Show Expense for a total expense of \$3,104. These figures are the same in Year to Date because there was no activity in January. We have \$768 in Car Club Merchandise. Our total contributions paid this year are \$500 and \$63,858 since our Club began. George Funk made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report and Carl Hillstead seconded. All approved.

Activities Report – Alan Taylor

There are changes coming up with the Strikes parking lot. The eating area has not changed, it is the patio area outside from our general meeting room. But what has changed is the area where we will park the cars, it is at the front of the entrance (which is the entrance) far left from the building from Lonetree Blvd. The show is still not confirmed yet either.

Al Alves received a Certificate of Appreciation for the great Halloween party that HE put on at his shop. It was a well-planned party and enjoyed by everyone.

Rich Ragan received an honorable mention for heading up the Citizens on Patrol (COP) as a Volunteer Coordinator. There were newspaper articles in both the Sacramento Bee and the Lincoln News Messenger complimenting Rich on his great work. Our Club also compliments Rich.

The Christmas party location was discussed and unanimously voted to be at Lincoln Hills/ Meridians Restaurant. A time and day will be established.

“Throw Back Thursday” at the Meridians will be planned for July and August.

The March 9th - Liberty Tax Event, the May 4th - Century 21 Show, and the March – June 2013 Car show Schedule were discussed as well as the April 7 Spaghetti Feed at the Car Museum in Sacramento.

Plans are being made for attendance to the NorthWest Street Rod Nationals in Washington State this June. See Ray Geiger or Alan.

Rods and Relics Car Show is gaining steam. We already have 2 Gold Sponsors, 34 cars registered, 25 raffle gifts and Kent Parsell has the permits from the City of Lincoln. Alan will head up the goody bags. Ray Blasquez will help with a better sound system. Kent has a lady to sing the National Anthem. We are not photographing cars coming in this year. More people are needed for parking. Mike Wolf from the VFW will head up the Clean-Up Committee.

Rich Ragan complimented our team that went to meet with the City of Lincoln: they were Kent Parsell, Julie McVey and Alan Taylor. They did an outstanding job.

The Thunder Valley Car Show & Shine is moving along.

Membership Report – George Funk

First time guest Tom Fish was introduced to the members, he has a 1954 blue Chevy 4 door. Returning guest Doug Wilson was present. Craig Frasier was voted in unanimously. Everyone was reminded about the requirement to attend one meeting every quarter or have a very good excuse.

The 501-C3 Tax Classification was discussed in regard to sponsors writing off their contributions. Until we get confirmation from someone with a better grasp on all of the technicalities of non-profit club rules, we will only use monies collected through dues for membership benefits.

Judy Rezendes said she could get the name of the President of the Model A Club and more information on the 501-C3 requirements.

The two-day event which includes admittance to the conference both days, lunch both days, and a tour of the California Auto Museum is a very good deal.

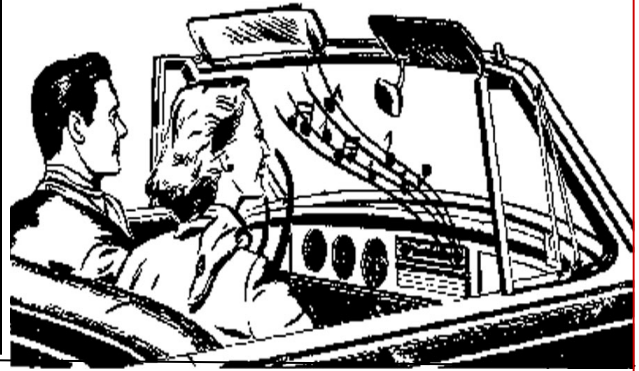
